A Message from Father Tim

Father Timothy Sas, Proistamenos

Dear Friends,

Last year at this time I would have laughed if anyone had described this major change in my family's life. Yet here I am navigating the conclusion of a major and beautiful chapter of my ministry at Twelve Holy Apostles Church in Duluth. Equally daunting is navigating the start of a new chapter of my ministry here with you. There's great joy in returning to you at St. Mary's but we are indeed sad to leave our parish family in Duluth. Even this past summer our plans and thoughts were that we would remain in Duluth permanently. The book of Proverbs warns otherwise: "A man's heart plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps." (Proverbs 16:9) Our family has been beautifully nurtured in the faith with the wonderful congregation of Twelve Holy Apostles Church. All six members of our family will always consider Duluth and that faithful parish a place of God's love which we will always consider home.

Simultaneously, there is excitement and anticipation about our return to St. Mary's. During our three years at St. Mary's in the early 2000s our family literally doubled in size as our three youngest daughters - Casiana, Theodora, and Sofia; Andrea was 1-year old when we arrived - were born during our time here. We have beautiful memories of learning and growing while we were here and we have maintained many friendships with parishioners in this parish. Through the St. Mary's Summer Camp and Family Camp our daughters have also grown friendships with teenagers and young adults at St. Mary's. The logistics of this transition are challenging for our family but we have begun arrangements and we're certain that with the Lord Jesus Christ leading us, moments of clarity will increase in number and frequency. Our test will be to place our trust in Him, as once again the book of Proverbs comes to my aid: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding." (Proverbs 3:5). This verse is particularly fitting for Presvytera Gabriela and I, as we had let go of how we understood our lives moving forward, but indeed, we trust in the Lord with all our heart that He will care for us as we take this step. St. Mary's Church is a place we both truly love and it is a community that serves the Lord Jesus and we are joyful to join you in that fruitful work.

We pray that all of you and your families receive God's blessings for the New Year of 2022 and for many, many years!

Church Cancellation Procedures for Winter

The winter months are upon us and we want to ensure all our parishioners stay safe and don't attempt to travel during icy or severe conditions. Here's how we plan to keep you informed.

- Cancellations of events, activities, and services will be announced a minimum of two hours prior to the start time.
- We will update our website and office voice mail announcing the cancellation as another opportunity for you to be notified.
- All individual group leaders (choir, church school, senior citizens, etc.) must notify the church office of the decision to cancel so we can make the necessary updates.
- The Parish Council President must also be notified of any cancellations, and no cancellations will occur without the blessing of our priests.

While we plan on always having scheduled services, no one should travel to church if road conditions in your area are dangerous. Please remain at home, participating in our live-streaming service, and giving thanks to God that at least a priest and chanter are leading the services praying for all of us.





Parishioners, Alexis and Anastasia Friesen, shared the following powerful testimonial with us on Sunday, October 31, 2021, following the Liturgy:

Alexis: *What does St. Mary's mean to me? This question sounds very similar to the question we ask the 3rd through 5th graders at summer camp, "What does Christ mean to me?" The camp program has been very impactful in our life at St. Mary's and today as we share our experience, it feels like we are answering the adult version of this classic camp question. Overall, St. Mary's Youth and Young Adult Programming in addition to the support of the community has been instrumental to how we have built and continue to build our lives as Orthodox Christians.*

Growing up, programs like summer camp, Sunday school, and GOYA taught us how to live our lives in the church. Many of the Sunday School Teachers, Camp Counselors, and older Orthodox kids (now adults) were and continue to be role models, even if they didn't know it. We both watched how they behaved both in and out of church and tried to follow their examples: going to the services, serving the church, and welcoming newcomers. In addition to our family, it was through many of these ministries that we learned how to have an Orthodox lifestyle and built a foundation for leading Christ centered lives. In my third year of college, I can now see how incredibly valuable this foundation has been as I have taken my spiritual life as my own.

Anastasia: *Orthodox Christian Fellowship (OCF) is a national ministry which works to connect college students to Christ and to one another. We are blessed to have a vibrant chapter on the U of M campus, and it is heavily supported by this community. Many people from this parish have generously donated meals and/or spoken at our meetings which has been invaluable support. Further, St. Mary's has funded numerous programs including yesterday's MNTRship Program, our Spring District Day, and College Conference transportation and scholarships. Because of this funding, we have been able to participate in an abundance of OCF programs that strengthen our relationship with God. In the future, this collection of experiences will only serve us as we build our lives on Christ.*

In closing, I was recently given advice to always surround myself with people I wish to be like as I pursue future programs and professional paths. I immediately thought of my St. Mary's community because I have many role models to look to. Our parish is full of generous, kind, loving, and supportive

By the time you read this newsletter, you will have received your stewardship envelope in the mail. Please take some time to prayerfully consider how you will support St. Mary's in the coming year.



In the Bookstore

At the Doors of Holy Lent is a great guide and companion for entering into the liturgical season of Great Lent. Written by Archimandrite Zacharias Zacharou of the Stavropegic Monastery of St. John the Baptist in Essex, England, this book focuses on the five Sundays preparing for the Triodion and the four Sundays of the Triodion. In addition

there is a section titled "Constant Principles for Our Spiritual Warfare." The Introductory Note explains:

During the period before the Triodion and the Sundays which mark its beginning, the Church sets forth before our eyes various lessons through the Gospel readings: the grateful Leper, the Blind Man of Jericho, Zacchaeus, the good and faithful Servant of the 'talents', the Canaanite woman, the Publican, the Prodigal Son and the Righteous on Judgment Day. Through some word, or deed, or attitude, these people all attracted God's gaze upon them. They became the target of his visitation and traversed centuries in an instant. These suffering souls, who had withered away either because of sin or because of not knowing the true God, came into the presence of the Lord and 'a spiritual sun, the name of which is persona, began to rise in them.

...In this way, the Church guides us, knowing the struggle which we are encouraged to undertake in order to find our deep heart, so that we may also become persons in the sight of our Creator and Judge, the targets of His visitation.

...The path is trodden. The constant principles are laid out with clarity, and we must keep them in our conscience as our polar star, as pearls of great price. We must embrace them so that they may render our labour fruitful not only during Great Lent, but also throughout our lives. (11-12)

Reading what Father Zacharias writes about the Gospel readings for each Sunday, we are sitting at the feet of a wise spiritual guide and elder inviting us to hear, know, and grow in this word of God. Father Zacharias writes:

In every passage of the Gospel we find a perfect teaching that portrays the whole Christ. He is hidden in every verse of Scripture, but according to the Fathers, in order to discover Him, we need to 'use the virtues of our hands to knock on the door of Scripture'. (52)

Reading *At the Doors of Holy Lent* we are knocking at the door of Scripture and Father Zacharias leads us through the doors with God-given wisdom and grace.

Note: The Sunday of the Ten Lepers, the first Sunday written about in this book, is on January 16 this year.
