Family Camp Reflection

We drove away from Summer Camp 2022 with a joyful sorrow! During our three-hour drive back home, my four kids, ages 7 through 12, wondered how they could make this camp experience last forever. This was our first time at Summer Camp 2022, after our move to the US in 2020. I listened to them as they brainstormed ideas. "We could keep singing the campfire songs we learnt." "We could hang the key-chains we made on our school bags and 'take camp' to school with us everyday." "We could light those beeswax candles we made and keep the flame of our faith going." "We could sing the hymn Lord of the Powers every morning on our way to school and remember our time in chapel." "Will we ever see the friends we made, again?" one of them asked. "Will they even remember us, next time we see them?"

There was silence in the car. I wanted to tell my kids that we always meet our friends in prayer wherever we are, whenever we pray or go to church. But, I knew that they wanted more! How could I make their camp experience last forever? How could I nurture their Orthodox Christian faith and help them cultivate long-lasting friendships that would prove to be great supports in their lives as adults?

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7).

This prayer was not to remain unanswered. Our loving God heard my silent prayer. Our all-compassionate Lord acknowledged my kids' joyful sorrow and provided at the right time!

Through the Saint Mary's Orthodox Camp programs, I knew of St. Mary's Fall Family Camp offered every second weekend in October. This year, on Friday, October 7, 2022, God was about to give my children another one of His great blessings.

My eagerness to kindle my children's faith and to encourage true Orthodox Christian friendships was recognized by God. He purposefully laid out for us the opportunity to participate again in the activities of our greater Orthodox Christian family; to worship among friends; to break bread; to explore God's blessed nature; to experience the true Christian joy; to deepen our faith; to grow stronger in our relationship with God; to warm our hearts with Christ's light so that we may sustain ourselves throughout the colds months of winter, until spring comes again.

On October 7, we made the three-hour drive from our home to Camp Courage at Maple Lake for the St. Mary's Family Camp. The ride was magnificent there and back. The fall colors were at their glory.

When we arrived at the camp site, I lost my children! I lost my children in the arms of our Lord and it was the most joyous feeling I had ever experienced: to see my children reunite with true friends; to recognize familiar faces in the care of camp counselors; to trust in the direction of father confessors!

This year's topic for the Family Camp was "Prayer." The program included sessions on what the Holy Fathers and Mothers say about prayer and practical advice on how to establish and strengthen the rule of prayer within the Orthodox Christian family.

- Take the time to pray.
- Keep to a rule.
- Prayer is a marathon; not a sprint
- Repetitions of prayers immunize against heresy.
- Prayers are active; God might choose to answer.
- Unanswered prayers are OK.
- Listen in the whisper!
- Expect attacks when you are praying.
- Stay vigilant.
- Pray the Psalter!

Adult and kids sessions where all structured around the practice of prayer in our faith and everybody was given opportunities to practice prayer: in the chapel; out in nature; by themselves or in groups with others. What a blessed opportunity to strengthen our communication with our heavenly Father! What a wonderful occasion to make resolutions on how to reinforce our family practices in order to make our homes "little Orthodox churches" for our Lord to abide.

We were the last ones to leave the camp site at the end of the program; we were probably the ones who had to drive the farthest to get home. My kids had already said goodbye to their friends but they still wanted to stay longer, enjoy the fall colors on that glorious Sunday of our Lord, and acknowledge the answers that God had provided to our prayers. St. Mary's Family Camp 2022 was over, but not quite...

About two week later, we received letters in the mail at our church's address. My kids' friends from camp initiated snail mail communication. And my kids reciprocated!

Orthodox Christian camp opportunities could be the start to wonderful, lasting connections and deep friendships for you, your children, your family! We hope to see you there next year, in the summer and the fall!

Parishioner Reimbursements

As a reminder, St. Mary's has a policy that allows for reimbursement only within the year the expense happened and within 30 days of incurring the expense. Should you have made an approved purchase on behalf of the parish, please submit your request for reimbursement today. We are only accepting requests from October and November currently, as the deadline for previous months has passed. Reimbursements for December 2022 purchases must be received in the church office by January 20 - expenses submitted beyond January 20 will not be accepted.

Expenses are processed weekly on Wednesday mornings. If you submit an expense after 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, it will be held until the following week. Once all invoices are entered into the system, expenses are electronically approved, and checks are generated and mailed directly to your home.

Year-End Giving Guidelines

It is hard to believe that we are in the final month of 2022. As we approach the end of both our calendar and fiscal year, it is important that the parish correctly record your stewardship gifts. Every dollar we receive before 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 28, will be recorded and reflected on your year-end Contribution Statement, and matched against your yearly pledge, as stewardship income for 2022. Electronic donations, via online giving or Venmo, must be received by Monday, December 26. Donations received after the deadline will be counted towards our budget for next year.

A parishioner may choose to provide additional funds to the church, indicating these dollars should be recorded as a donation for a future year. While we can make a notation of this request, the funds will still be recorded and reported as income for 2022. Your Statement of Financial Giving will accurately reflect all income received within the calendar year.

Saint Mary's 2022 Stewardship Campaign Update

Thank you for your participation in our 2022 Stewardship Campaign and your on-going support of St. Mary's through your gifts of time, talent, and treasure.

<u>As of November 7, 2022, we have received \$812,076 in</u> <u>Stewardship Income.</u>

- This represents only 64% of this year's budget for ministries and operating expenses and is slightly behind compared to where we were last year at this time.
- An additional \$457,724 is needed by year end to cover all our costs.


- Church costs per day for operating and ministries = \$3,479

Timeless Truths: The Annual Liturgical Cycle for Every Year is composed of the teachings of Father Symeon Kragiopoulos (1926-2015), edited with a translation by Theophilos Lasswell. Two of Father Symeon's previous books—"May It Be Blessed" and Anxiety (How It Is Created and How It Is Healed)—have been best

sellers in the bookstore. *Timeless Truths* gives readers the opportunity to listen to the wisdom of this elder for a whole year. Organized to follow the liturgical year, there is an introductory note that explains liturgical time and how to use this book in sync with the liturgical year. For each day, Father Symeon offers brief words of wisdom, humble advice, a thought to ponder....Each entry takes a minute or less to read, but often contains food for thought to nourish the reader throughout the day—and beyond.

One of the remarkable talents Father Symeon has in his writings is to begin with a sentence that immediately draws the reader in and focuses them to anticipate what is ahead. A few examples of these leading sentences are:

- *No one is put in order with a single confession. (70) *Everybody looks for joy. (83)
- *The entire life of a human being looks—paradoxical though it may seem—as if it is a battle against God. (104)
- *With sins, something analogous happens with what happens with grass. (106)
- *Every person, regardless of who he is and how old he might be, down to the child in his cradle, has within his being, within his constitution, this great truth: he wants to assert his existence. (107)

- *We think that we are going to meet Christ at very special moments. (180)
- *All things that happen to people have within them the mystery of salvation. (184)
- *Wake up and start your day with zeal. (200)
- *We all have a predisposition to appreciate certainty. (303)
- *Normally, one is a victim of one's feelings, thoughts, mindset, even of the coercive complexes that are in him. (386)

For each day, some of the saints celebrated are listed. Father Symeon occasionally bases his meditation on one of these saints, noting a characteristic of the saint and how that characteristic might be—or is—applicable to the reader.

Several themes are underlying and overarching in Father Symeon's writing, and the reader will meet them many times throughout the liturgical year. For example: the vital importance of prayer, humility, repentance, being always grateful, accepting pain, obedience, and parenting.

Read with openness, Father Symeon's thoughts and reflections in *Timeless Truths* are gifts to the reader for reflection, meditation, and perhaps action—all in the love and light of Christ. This book is a good Christmas gift looking to the year ahead.


