Church Cancellation Procedures for Winter

Winter has arrived in Minnesota, and we want to remind all our parishioners to stay safe and not to attempt to travel during icy or severe conditions. Here is how we plan to keep you informed during this winter season.

- Cancellations of events, activities, and services will be announced a minimum of two hours prior to the start time.
- Committee/Ministry Heads only are the ones who can cancel on behalf of their group.
- All individual group leaders (choir, church school, senior citizens, etc.) must notify the church office of the decision to cancel so the necessary notifications can occur.
- Should a cancellation happen after office hours or on the weekend, you are encouraged to contact our Parish Administrator (612.503.0653) to inform them of the decision.
- We will update our website and social media platforms announcing the cancellation as another opportunity for you to be notified. We encourage you to take time now to follow us on Instagram and Facebook.
- The Parish Council President must also be notified of any cancellations, and no cancellations will occur without the blessing of our priests.
- For any scheduled Worship Services, only the Proistamenos has the authority to cancel.

We plan to serve all the scheduled worship services but urge you to use your best judgment to determine if the road conditions near you are safe for travel. We will live-stream our worship services to allow all to watch and pray along from your homes.

Stewardship

On November 13, we were fortunate to hear parishioner Sasha Nicolle's testimony as part of our 2022 Stewardship Campaign.

"Good morning. It's an honor to have the opportunity to share a bit about what this parish community means to me. It won't be easy to express it in five minutes - but I will do my best!

To fully express what this community has meant for me, I need to share a couple of details that I don't typically share so publicly, but if I don't, the significance will be lost.

The first being an event that happened about a year before I started attending St. Mary's. I had been going to a protestant church that I loved for about three years and was really invested in the community. Until I started to realize that the teachings of that church didn't fully align with scripture or historical Christian doctrine. I was torn about what to do as this would have been the third time, I had left a church due to theological differences and to be honest, I was tired of it. One Sunday during the sermon, I grew exasperated with the teaching, sighed, and looked up when I had a vision.

In the vision I was here in the nave. I was sitting in the front row (point) looking up at the Icon of Christ. The alter and pews were completely empty, but then 3 women came in and sat in the pew behind me. They seemed to recognize that I was new. One very kindly asked, "What brings you here?" And I responded, "I didn't know where else I could go."

You would think I would have come straight to St. Mary's after that vision - but it took me about a year afterwards to finally acquiesce to the nudge from the Holy Spirit. To be honest, I was nervous that as a Scandinavian redhead I would stick out like a sore thumb amongst a sea of Mediterraneans!

Finally, one morning I said to God, "Fine, I'll go, and I'll get it out of my system and then I'll find a nice Baptist church to join." Well, here we are, nearly four years later, I haven't had a desire to go anywhere else.

I was very touched by the warm welcome I received here, and in particular by a handful of women who were so kind to always greet me and introduce me to others. What's more, some of these women have become very dear friends and mentors to me. Some of them have laughed with me during good times and have prayed with and for me during challenging ones.

It occurred to me one day that perhaps these women were represented in the vision I had that morning about five years ago. But to fully express why these friendships have meant so much to me, I have to share something about my childhood that I rarely bring up so publicly.

As a young girl I watched my mom battle some pretty intense illnesses. When I was 11 she went to be with the Lord. She certainly wasn't perfect, or always able to care for me as most healthy mothers do, but the best thing she ever did for me was to share her faith. I honestly don't know if I would know the Lord as intimately as I do, if I had not had her influence in my life. So when she passed, I not only lost my mom, but my spiritual compass. Throughout my adolescent years I felt pretty lost without an older and wiser female guide to look up to. Fortunately, I could go to scripture for direction - and found the Epistles to be particularly helpful as I tried to navigate what it meant to really live out my faith on a daily basis. But the lack of a Godly female presence was apparent.

Later, as I began college, I noticed that many of my peers were close with their moms, they enjoyed going for coffee or shopping, and could talk to their moms about so many different things. In that season of my life, I found myself grieving her in a whole new way - I realized that I would never have the opportunity to know her as a friend.

I certainly am not looking for someone to replace my mom, no one could, but I have been touched by the handful of women in this Parish who have come alongside me as living role models and guides in the faith. These women have generously embraced me as family and have encouraged me in my spiritual growth and in other facets too. Their presence and influence in my life has been a tremendous gift, and I am deeply grateful to know these beautiful, classy, kind, intelligent and Godly women thanks to this parish community."

In the Bookstore

Dr. Steven Rakes has made many pilgrimages to Mount Athos together with other men from St. Mary's under the guidance of Dr. Harry Boosalis. While on the Holy Mountain, the men had many opportunities to be in conversation with monks living there. Dr. Rakes made it his mission to take notes, and these notes have

now become a book titled Wisdom from the Holy Mountain: Life Lessons from the Monks of Mt. Athos. He writes in the prologue:

It was a miracle to me that I was able to remember so much of what was said. I always believed that these notes would be for my friends, family, and me alone. It was not my intention to publish these gems. But during one of my visits, I shared some of this with a monk from Iviron and he said, "Do not hide what you have learned; share it with everyone." Although these thoughts were delivered by monks to men, I believe these teachings are not for men only but can enrich the lives of everyone who reads them.

What you will read in this collection is a summary of the notes I took on these visits....Some of this is repetitive, and that reflects the number of times the monks emphasized a particular point. I want you, the reader, to be able to experience the information as I did. Just as we were able to ask the monks questions about different topics in our minds and hearts, the notes are presented here by topic in the hope that you might be able to read their wisdom about a topic close to your mind and heart, instead of feeling the need to read the story from beginning to end. (2-3)

There is a comprehensive table of contents to facilitate access to specific topics. But note to readers: topics are often so rich in meaning and relevancy that they overflow and pour into other topics, so reading widely within the book multiplies the blessings the wisdom imparts.

Although most of the life lessons are given by monks who remain anonymous (Monk 1, Monk 2, etc.), Dr. Rakes provides brief biographies so one can perhaps appreciate more what—and perhaps the context from which—a specific monk is sharing with those listening.

Wisdom from the Holy Mountain: Life Lessons from the Monks of Mt. Athos is physically a small book, but it is huge in wisdom and guidance for people living in the world. It is also remarkably encouraging. Dr. Rakes notes:

One beautiful aspect of the monks I encountered was the positive encouragement that I received from them. Whenever I spoke negatively about myself or the way I was conducting my life, they always spoke words of encouragement, pointing out to me the good in my life and reminding me that life in the world is difficult and that my efforts toward spiritual growth were honored by God. (3)

This is a book for people of all ages teenage and above. No matter what one's life circumstances are, one will find relevant wisdom and guidance from the monks. Their messages are alive in the tradition of Scripture and the Holy Fathers. One of the notes included aptly describes this book: "The Holy Spirit comes to the reader from holy books." (8)

Dr. Rakes is donating 100% of the proceeds from his book to the Church. Whether you buy the book as a gift for yourself or for someone else, you are also giving a gift to St. Mary's.

For people reading this article at a geographic distance from St. Mary's, the bookstore can mail the book if you e-mail your request to <u>bookstore@stmarysgoc.org</u> The book is \$12 and the shipping charge is \$4. Payment can be made online. The physical book is not currently available from a public forum, but the ebook is available from Amazon.
