### A Message from Father John Kostas

#### A Prophecy of Fr. Roman Braga

A confessor in the Orthodox Church is someone who undergoes horrible sufferings inflicted in an effort to force him to recant his faith, but who endures in his confession to the end.

Such a man was Fr. Roman Braga, abbot of the Holy Dormition Monastery in Rives Junction, Michigan, until his recent passing.

Fr. Roman sustained unspeakable torments as a prisoner of the communist regime in Romania, kept in a filthy cell while weathering many beatings. Yet he not only emerged triumphant, he also found the spiritual strength to forgive his tormentors and even to thank God for the sufferings he withstood.

While at the monastery, it was Fr. Roman's inspiriting habit to address groups of visiting pilgrims. On one occasion, the conversation turned to the many ways in which American society seemed to be going astray from God.

Fr. Roman's response? He said that Americans were a good and welcoming people — but needed to suffer if they were to return to faith! He spoke these words not in condemnation, but in a calm and loving way, yet with firmness of purpose.

He then added: God would someday allow such suffering to bring us back to our spiritual senses. When such a man as Fr. Roman speaks this way, it is not merely a prediction. It is a prophecy. Is that prophecy now being fulfilled?

Hard to say. Perhaps the best approach is to recall the words of warning of Our Lord to the wealthy farmer who spent his time planning more wealth, 'bigger barns.'

You fool! This very night your soul is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be? (Luke 12:20).

One person who heard Fr. Roman reported that, in spite of the grave message, she did not feel scared, because she knew that Fr. Roman meant that God allows suffering for our salvation. God helped Fr. Roman be strong in his faith, and the torturing times merely wrapped him in gentleness and love.



Stunned by the beauty of Holy Trinity Monastery in Guatemala.

Beauty in the silence and stillness.

Beauty in the flora and fauna.

Beauty in the community of people living there.

Beauty within each individual- created in His image and shining forth in His likeness.

Beauty in Christ Jesus who is the true icon/the image of God.

Glory to God!

I have just returned from a three week visit and intensive icon workshop at the Monastery of the Holy Trinity. I am awe-struck by the hospitality, dedication, and good Spirit of the community living at the monastery—currently Igumeni Madre Ines, Madre Ivonne, and Mother Maria. In addition, there are currently four young women, three children and five young men living there. These young adults, ages 20 to 28, currently are all working within the monastery and/or studying. Andrea just graduated from a cosmetology school, Guadalupe graduated from the Friendship University of Russia in arts and ceramics (www.rudn,ru). Astrid graduated with a degree in marketing administration from the University of Galileo. Isabel has begun her veterinary studies. Miguel continues to study technology and does some specialized work in the area of archeology/decoding ancient writings

on Mayan ruins in Guatemala. Samuel's greatest gift is to serve in the altar. This is just to name a few. Others are living independently and employed.

So what are the nuns doing? There are now about 17+ young adults who were under their quardianship, however, never adopted out. These young people are dearly beloved family who always welcome "home." The nuns are dedicated and untiring in their efforts in providing opportunities for them to take responsibility to better their own lives. There is additional property adjacent to and owned by Holy Trinity Monastery which has recently been graded and further developed for the building of homes. 17 of these 40 lots have been gifted (deed given to these former residents of the Hogar Rafael Orphanage). The lots are situated high above Lake Amatitlan, a lake surrounded by volcanoes, wild flora and fauna, a magnificent view. These now young adults, in due time, can apply for a low interest, long term loan and work to become owners of a home. Hopefully, the building of the first home will being within the next few months. This "affordable housing" project is currently of primary focus of the Friends of the Hogar Rafael Ayau non-profit organization. See fhrayau.org for more detail.

Over many years, the Orthodox parishes from Minnesota and Wisconsin have strongly supported and continue to support the mission work of these three courageous nuns. They are yet vitally concerned with the well-being of these "HomeKids" now young adults. As I've often heard Mother Ines ask, "And what would you want for your children?" We want to see them flourish and grow into the persons God intended them to be, totally reliant on God, persevering in faith, and living fruitful lives. This affordable housing is the continuation of a beautiful charitable Orthodox community. The seeds have been planted. By the grace of God and your support, it will flourish and grow. 

## In the Bookstore

The Mystery of Christian Life by Saint Sophrony the Athonite (1896-1993) has recently been published in an English translation of the original text written in Russian. Both are published by the monastery Saint Sophrony founded—the Stavropegic Monastery of St John the Baptist in Essex, England.

Hieromonk Nicholas, the compiler of this book, writes in a superb and truly edifying foreward:

The majority of the texts in this book are taken from St. Sophrony's collection of drafts which did not reach book form in his lifetime, because he was so occupied in taking care of the monastery and those who visited with need of his prayer and counsel. The texts began in handwritten form, often on already-used paper, so that not a scrap of paper—each one a gift from God—would be wasted. The final drafts were type-written. Some texts were in files; others were on loose papers, many of which were not in any particular order.

Most of the chapters here are compilations of such notes, grouped by theme, but again, not rigidly delineated. (20-21)

For readers who have read books by Saint Sophrony, The Mystery of Christian Life will be a welcome and, for many, a long anticipated book. Hieromonk Nicholas notes, "Those who have read the books of St. Sophrony already published in English will find some of the thoughts expressed here familiar." (17) For readers who have not read anything by Saint Sophrony, this book is a great introduction to this Saint and the length and breadth and height and depth of the divine wisdom and insight he was given and shared.

Entering into the world of the Elder's word/idea, we are spiritually immersed in God's presence, in which he himself lived. Every moment spent consciously in this sphere acts in a mysterious way upon the whole man: spirit, soul, and even body....The saint's words are the fruit of long years of weeping and intense prayer, and they transfigure the reader in his 'inner man'... (18)

Much is revealed about the content of this book from the chapter titles: "Reflections on Monastic Life;" "The Life of Our Monastery;" "The Path I have Travelled;" "On Faith;" "The Person-Hypostasis;" "On Prayer;" "Creativity;" "The Service of Mothers to the Church and the World;" "On Marriage;" "Knowledge of God, Knowledge of Humanity;" "Mankind and Human History;" "Spiritual Life;" and "Spiritual Striving." The epilogue was also written by St. Sophrony with a penciled note: "for the end of the book" without specifying the book. The Mystery of Christian Life is truly a compilation of life giving writings.

Concluding the foreward, Hieromonk Nicholas writes:

This is a book to be read slowly and prayerfully, the reader's aim being spiritual and theological nourishment. There are many reflections here that have not been expressed in earlier books. And what we seem to have read elsewhere is refreshed by the inspired way it is expressed, and by our discovery of hitherto unexpressed nuances. (21)



# REGIONAL LENTEN RETREAT
