AHEPA – the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association – is the largest Greek heritage group in the world, and a major community service organization in the U.S., Canada, Greece, Cyprus, Europe, Central America, and Australia.

The central objectives of AHEPA are philanthropy, education, civics, and the promotion of Hellenic culture and heritage through national, district, and local efforts.

AHEPA has awarded millions of dollars in direct scholarships to hundreds of thousands Greek American students over the past ninety years.

Nationally, AHEPA works to educate American policy makers and the public on foreign policy issues of concern to Greek Americans. Additionally, AHEPA's philanthropy has benefited projects that include the AHEPA TRIBUTE sculpture which is now one of two major artworks permanently displayed in Atlanta in conjunction with the 1996 Olympics; the AHEPA Educational Foundation; major underwriting of the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island restorations; and funding for various medical research projects.

At the district level, AHEPA has provided countless numbers of the children within the Minneapolis Greek community, as well as those from across the district, with monies to assist in the financing of their higher education.

Locally, AHEPA continually supports local causes like the Immigration History Research Center, Service Dogs for Warriors, IOCC, and many programs of St. Mary's Greek Orthodox Church. AHEPA also provides numerous social and cultural activities for the local community.
