Eighth Sunday of Matthew; Silas, Silvan, Crescens, Epenetus and Andronicus the Apostles of the 70; Julitta of Caesaria.

Morning Gospel: John 20:11-18 Tone: Grave

### Variable Hymns and Readings in the Liturgy

### At the Second Antiphon

Save us, O Son of God, who rose from the dead, save us who sing to you: Alleluia!

### At the Small Entrance Resurrection Hymn, Grave Tone

By your cross, O Lord, you destroyed death; to the thief you opened paradise. The myrrh- bearers' sorrow you transformed into joy, and you sent your apostles forth to proclaim that you had risen from the dead, Christ our God, bestowing on all the world your great mercy.

#### **Hymn of Entrance**

Come, let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us, O Son of God, who rose from the dead, save us who sing to You: Alleluia!

Repeat the Resurrection Hymn, above.

### Hymn of the Dormition of the Theotokos, First Tone

In giving birth, you preserved your virginity, O Theotokos; in falling asleep you did not forsake the world.

You passed over into life, O Mother of Life; and by your prayers you deliver our souls from death!

#### Kontakion of the Transfiguration, Grave Tone

You were transfigured on the mountain, O Christ our God, showing your disciples as much of your glory as they could bear, so that when they see you crucified they will know that you suffer freely, and they will tell all the world that you are truly the radiance of the Father.

### Epistle ...... I Corinthians 1:10-17

Brethren, I appeal to you by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no dissensions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brethren. What I mean is that each one of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispos and Gaius; lest any one should say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized any one else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

At that time, Jesus saw a great throng; and he had compassion on them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a lonely place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They said to him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass; and taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven, and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Then he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

#### **Additional Prosforo Needed**

Our supply of prosforo for weekday liturgies and excess Sunday needs is low. We are asking prosforo makers to bake a batch at any time in the coming weeks and months (while our chairs are traveling) to help us restock. Here's the process:

- Wrap finished loaves well for freezer storage, including a plastic bag with all the air squeezed out. (In the past, loaves with freezer burn were not usable.)
- Label each loaf with the date baked and note if the seal is good.
- Place loaves in the freezer in the room behind the altar on the south side.
- Stop by the Philoptochos table if you need a prosforo recipe.
   Recipes are also in the Come Sit at Our Table Cookbook, if you have a copy.
