The Saint with Cancer

On November 9, we celebrate one of the most popular saints of our time, St. Nektarios. St. Nektarios is especially known for his many miracles God has worked through him; thus he is among the "wonderworker" or "miracle worker" saints. Many people also know by reading his life story or by seeing the recent movie Man of God about his suffering due to slander. Because he was pushed out of Egypt due to slander, the beloved hierarch did not become Patriarch of Alexandria. He suffered from people-including fellow clergy—slandering him. But there is another aspect of Saint Nektarios' suffering that is sometimes overlooked or glossed over. Saint Nektarios died of prostate cancer.



Nearly all of us know someone who has died from cancer. There are nearly two million cancer diagnosis every year in the United States. And we can ask ourselves, why? Sometimes we may ask, "what did he/ (continued on page 3)

she/I do wrong?" We may try to make sense of it. One prayer from the service of the visitation of the sick quotes Matthew 5:45, "for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." In other words, bad and good things can happen to both moral and immoral people. Suffering is a part of this fallen world. Even extremely righteous people, like Saint Nektarios, suffer in this life. He died of prostate cancer.

Today, we have an opportunity to help those who are suffering. One way is to join the Visitation Team. At our upcoming November 5 training session, we organize, train, and equip volunteers to go and visit our parishioners who can no longer come to church due to age or a health condition. Our volunteers may visit our parishioners in

nursing homes or in their private homes. Team members help ease the suffering of those who ask, "why?" in a time of suffering. The time commitment is not big. Our training session lasts for about an hour after church on November 5. Then we would like each volunteer to choose one V.I.P., one Very Important Parishioner, and try to visit that V.I.P. about once a month. It is a great system...but we need your help! Help us visit our home-bound or nursing-home bound parishioners. We can do this by attending our training on November 5 where you will be equipped to help us with this beautiful ministry. There are many V.I.P.s would love to have you come visit! Visiting our V.I.P.s is more fun than "volunteer work." It is a joy to get to know our elderly or suffering parishioners. spend time with them, share some laughs, hear some great stories, and make a meaningful connection. We can do this, all the while, lightening the load—even if it is just a little—of an aging or suffering V.I.P. Please let us know if you can help us in this important and joyous ministry. 



Simpson Housing Services Meal




Thanks each of those who reached out to create a meal for those who are homeless and those volunteers who helped serve.




Behold a Great Light: A Daily Devotional for the Nativity Fast through Theophany is a new book from Ancient Faith Publishing. One could say this was an "in house" project because the editor, Lynette Horner, is a staff editor for Ancient Faith and the contributors are authors, bloggers, and podcasters for Ancient Faith. There are eight contributors and each provides a week of meditations.

The contributors, listed in the chronological order in which they are included in this book, are Fr. Stephen Freeman, Laura S. Jansson, Fr. Basil Ross Aden, Brandi Willis Schreiber, Elissa Bjeletich Davis, Fr. Michael Gillis, Nicole M. Roccas, and Fr. Stephen De Young. Each one writes from their gifted and cultivated perspective, so the reader is given a variety of daily companions for their journey through the Nativity Fast and the Christmas season to Theophany and the day following which is the Synaxis of St. John the Forerunner and Baptist.

This is a book to help the reader keep focused on and in the heart of Christmas during the Advent fast when "the world" seems to be preoccupied with and focused on celebrating and the materialness of gift giving and all else that comes—or goes—along with the commercialization of Christmas and the Christmas season. 


