Commemoration

Synaxis of John the Holy Glorious Prophet, Baptist, and Forerunner; Afterfeast of the Theophany of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; Cedd, Bishop of Scotland; Fursey, Abbot of Lagny

Morning Gospel: John 20:19-31

Variable Hymns and Readings in the Liturgy

Tone: Plagal Second

At the Second Antiphon

Save us, O Son of God, baptized by John in the Jordan, to you we sing, Alleluia!

At the Third Antiphon

Hymn of Theophany, First Tone

When you, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan River, the worship of the Trinity was revealed. And the voice of the Father bore witness to you, calling you his beloved Son and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the Word as truth. O Christ our God, you have appeared and enlightened the world. Glory to you.

At the Small Entrance

Hymn of Entrance, Second Tone

Come, let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us, O Son of God, who rose from the dead, save us who sing to You: Alleluia!

Resurrection Hymn, Plagal Second Tone

The angelic powers appeared at your tomb, the soldiers guarding it became as dead men, and Mary stood at your grave seeking, seeking your most pure body. But you made hell a captive; you were untouched by its might. You came to the virgin and granted life.

O Lord, who rose from the dead, glory to you.

Hymn of Saint John the Baptist, Second Tone

O Forerunner, the memory of the righteous is praised in song, but the witness of the Lord was sufficient for you. For you were truly shown forth as more honored than the prophets, since you were made worthy to baptize in the streams him who was proclaimed. Therefore, since you contended above all for the truth, with joy you preached the good news even to those in Hades: God has appeared in the flesh, taking away the sin of the world and granting to us great mercy!

Hymn of the Dormition of the Theotokos, First Tone

In giving birth, you preserved your virginity, O Theotokos; in falling asleep you did not forsake the world. You passed over into life, O Mother of Life; and by your prayers you deliver our souls from death!

Kontakion of Theophany, Fouth Tone

You have revealed yourself to the world today, and your light shines forth on us, who sing your praise with full knowledge: You have come to us, O Lord; you are made manifest, O inaccessible Light!

Trisagion Hymn (In place of Holy God)

As many of you as have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves in Christ. Alleluia!

In those days, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul passed through the upper country and came to Ephesus. There he found some disciples. And he said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" And they said, "No, we have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." And he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They said, "Into John's baptism." And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Spirit came on them; and they spoke with tongues and prophesied. There were about twelve of them in all. And he entered the synagogue and for three months spoke boldly, arguing and pleading about the kingdom of God.

At that time, John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, for he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but for this I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John bore witness, "I saw the Spirit descend as a dove from heaven, and it

remained on him. I myself did not know him; but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."

Megalynarion (instead of *It is truly meet and right*), *Second Tone*Verse: Magnify, O my soul, her who is greater in honor than the hosts on high.

O most pure Bride, O blessed Mother, the wonders of your birth-giving pass all understanding. Through you we have obtained salvation in all things, and, as is right and meet, we rejoice before you our Benefactor, bearing as a gift a song of thanksgiving!

Communion Hymn

The memory of the righteous will endure, endure forever (*Psalm 111:7*). Alleluia!

(After Communion)

Instead of "We Have Seen the Light," we chant the **Hymn of Thoephany**When you, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan River, the worship of the Trinity was revealed. And the voice of the Father bore witness to you, calling you his beloved Son and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the Word as truth. O Christ our God, you have appeared and enlightened the world.
