

Reflections on Family Camp 2023

Learning about the Christian Family through the Orthodox Camping **Experience**

Over the years families around Twin Cites gather together on the first weekend of October at Family Camp.

So, what is it about the camp experience that makes our families love it so much?

Certainly, many things contribute to it: friends, activities, the speaker, services, and being in the outdoors, to name a few. The thing that makes camp so special, however, is the camp environment, which presents a living experience of the Orthodox faith.

Family Camp transforms the lives of families and nurtures their faith in Jesus Christ through Orthodox Christian community living, worship, education, fellowship, and love.

Why do families attend?

To learn Christian living by doing it. It's the best way to learn. The best way to learn is by doing things. When you come to Family Camp, you get to do everything in a Christian fashion. You get to pray together, to learn new things, to listen to each other, and that means that you get to share your life experiences...We learn and sing church hymns, we have a good time at our meals, and we play games in the evening. The campers learn Who we worship and why we worship. Campers also learn how to pray and are encouraged to make it part of their morning and evening routine. It's great to be at camp. It's one of the greatest experiences that a family can have together.

Our camping programs have become a vital part of the spiritual growth of the families in the Midwest. Camp provides not only a place for them to learn about our faith but also to learn

how to live our faith. Without the support from the Orthodox Church, many of our families would not have had this experience.

The spiritual education at camp is always centered around a different curriculum each year; allowing adult campers to explore different theological concepts and lessons. It also provides well-rounded knowledge to help equip the young campers to live a richer spiritual life.

Family Camp offers a chance to have a great weekend together with your immediate family members and other Orthodox Christians. For children, they need to meet other Orthodox kids and create new friendships. The friendships you make at camp are essential to developing a full and healthy spiritual life.

But the best part of Family Camp is the FUN! Camp is for the camper! Activities and programs are designed to provide entertainment, excitement, and joyful memories for each camper, especially the campfire and the songs that we sing.

The memories that campers make during Family Camp are carried through their entire lives.

We are blessed to have this program for our families in the Twin Cities.

Mixers



Sing to Your Soul: On Daily Christian Living is the third volume of A Festival of Wisdom for the Christian Life in selected passages by Saint John Chrysostom. The passages were compiled, edited, and translated by David Ford. The reader is offered the wisdom and insight of one of the greatest and most beloved Church Fathers through passages that are so relevant they seem to be contemporary. In the biographical note included in the book, the editor writes:

Saint John Chrysostom (347-407) is renowned as one of the greatest Christian preachers in the history of the Church. He's equally respected as a great Biblical commentator. We see both of these remarkable talents displayed in the passages contained in this book. (226)

David Ford did superb work collating the passages so the reader is drawn from one to another almost seamlessly and often eagerly seeking more of the grace revealed in each one. The topics included are, in order of presentation: "The Home as a Little Church," "Knowing the Love of God for Us," "Dwelling in Christ," "Living a Life of Virtue," "On Repentance," "Prayer," "Our Love for God," "The Goodness and Power of Love," "Loving One's Enemies," "The Heavenly Perspective," "Apatheia," "Joy," "Humility," "Patience," "Bearing Tribulation Nobly," "Spiritual Warfare," "The Power of the Cross in Daily Life," "Dealing with Despondency," "Scripture Reading," "Hospitality," "Almsgiving," and "Preparation for Death."

Most of the passages in this book are extracts from sermons, Scripture commentaries, or letters St. John wrote, addressed to and for a very specific audience. Yet when he speaks or writes very specifically about a human condition, he is speaking or writing universally, hence the remarkable relevance to all anywhere in and of all ages.

Reading this book is like sitting at the feet of a very wise elder who clearly knows the human heart and gently, yet firmly, wants listeners to see—discern— and know Christ within them and also calling them through His word and their life experience. He is a master at helping the reader or listener put their life in an eternal perspective and live in the light of this awareness. For example, in a homily he explains:

Reading the Scriptures is like sifting through treasure. With treasure, if one finds even a tiny nugget he can gain for himself great wealth. Just so with the divine Scriptures, for even in a short phrase one can find a great depth of meaning, wealth beyond telling. (166)

Sing to Your Soul: On Daily Christian Living is an encouraging book. The subjects are most often presented in quite short passages for the benefit of the reader/listener. Remarkably, one does not feel preached to but invited to grow in insight, understanding, and appreciation for Christ in all and thru all. The awareness of the agape love that permeated Saint John Chrysotom comes through clearly in this book.

Below is a beautiful testimony from one of our parishioners, Erline Holman, who shared her message following the Liturgy on November 5, 2023, and highlighted how Engagement at St. Mary's has been meaningful to her.

I was asked to speak about church engagement today. I learned about being involved in church from my parents. I grew up on a dairy farm in Wisconsin and attended a very small rural Lutheran parish. Church was the center of our family life. We were there for every service and event at the church, even working at the annual lutefisk supper. I learned that church is where friends become family. I met my husband Brad in high school and after we were married, we continued serving and working in the churches we attended. We moved to Rochester, MN in 1990. At that time, we were attending an evangelical church. It was through Brad that our journey to Orthodoxy began. Brad was adopted as an infant and was always told he was a lot of nationalities, including Greek. The possibility of being Greek always interested him especially growing up in a town where Norwegians were the dominant

nationality. In the early 2000's, Brad began a search for his biological family. He discovered his father was Greek and his mother was German. Brad became very interested in researching his Greek heritage. In 2002, he attended his first Divine Liturgy at Holy Anargyroi in Rochester. For Brad, it felt like coming home, and he was baptized and chrismated into the Orthodox Church in 2003. It took me a bit longer before I too became Orthodox. I was chrismated six years later in 2009. We continued our practice of being engaged in the church. We moved to Minneapolis six and half years ago. I have to say, attending our first service at St Mary's was very intimidating. It is a lot bigger than Holy Anargyroi. My first thought, when we sat down on that Sunday morning, was I wonder whose pew we are sitting in. When you come to a large church like St. Mary's, it is very easy to not get involved. You can come to church every Sunday, but never make an effort to become involved in anything else. It is not always easy to cultivate relationships during coffee hour. I think we were here for three weeks before someone actually sat down and talked to us. We were determined to make this our church home and become involved. So, what did we do? We started attending the Saturday morning Bible study where we met a wonderful group of people that quickly became friends. We volunteered at our first Greek festival. Working side by side is a great way to connect and meet new people. We were working with Elena Biessner, and she introduced us to everyone that was working, and when she found out I sang in choir at Holy Anargyroi, she invited me to join the choir. I met another group of people that I shared a love of music with. St. Mary's is large, but there are so many ways to get connected and stay engaged. Philoptochos, missions and outreach, men and women's Bible studies, game night, youth activities, book club, and Senior Citizens just to name a few. Just look at our newsletter for everything going on. All ways for us to make those connections. It is not always easy, and it may require you to step out of your comfort zone. But your faith will be enriched when your church family become your friends.

When you are engaged in your church, your relationship to Christ is also enhanced. St Mary's is our home, it is where we worship and serve. I challenge all of you, if you have not developed those kinds of relationships at church, find one activity to become involved in. Find something you are passionate about. Growth through relationships leads to a vibrant church.


