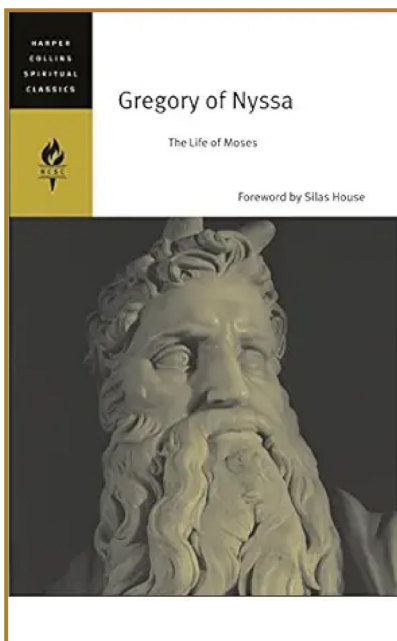

In the Bookstore

When Mother Gabriella, the abbess of Holy Dormition Monastery in Rives Junction, Michigan, offered the sermon to the congregation at Saint Mary's on the Sunday of Orthodoxy, she told how Father Roman Braga, a beloved hieromonk who lived at the monastery in his later years, would recommend people read a good book during Lent, and he suggested **The Life of Moses** as a good book to choose. Rightly so—and not only for Lent because this a relevant book for living in the light of Christ in all the seasons and circumstances of life.

The *Life of Moses* is about the spiritual journey, revealing and explaining many analogies between the life of Moses and Christ. It was written by Saint Gregory of Nyssa (335-394) in response to a letter asking him “for some counsel concerning the perfect life.” (3) He writes:

Let us put forth Moses as our example for life in our treatise. First we shall go through in outline his life as we have learned it from the divine Scriptures. Then we shall seek out the spiritual understanding which corresponds to the history in order to obtain suggestions of virtue. Through such understanding we may come to know the perfect life for men. (8)

Therefore, the book is divided into two sections: “The Life of Moses” based on the biblical account of his life in Exodus and Numbers, then “Contemplation on the Life of Moses.” Throughout and in detail, Saint Gregory keeps focused on Christ and the life of virtue exemplified by Moses in the many aspects of his life and the responsibilities he had and experienced, together with the many challenges he faced. Saint Gregory readily notes when the analogy he is making of Moses to Christ reaches a limit, letting the reader know thereby the endlessness of virtue and perfection in Christ. He explains:

The knowledge of God is a mountain steep indeed and difficult to climb—the majority of people scarcely reach its base. If one were a Moses, he would ascend higher and hear the sound of trumpets which, as the text of the history says, becomes louder as one advances. For the preaching of the divine nature is truly a trumpet blast, which strikes the hearing, being already loud at the beginning, but becoming yet louder at the end. The Law and the Prophets trumpeted the divine mystery of the incarnation... (78-79)

This book is an excellent entry into patristic reading as it is permeated with connections, links, and bridges from the literal and often academic understanding of the Old Testament into the New Testament in the light of Christ. Saint Gregory writes humbly and yet succinctly, sometimes using expressions such as “I think” or “it seems to me” to let the reader know they are invited to understand and appreciate the perspective he is providing without the sense of being dictated to in the process.

The Life of Moses could be considered an explanation of or treatise on John 1:17: “For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.”
